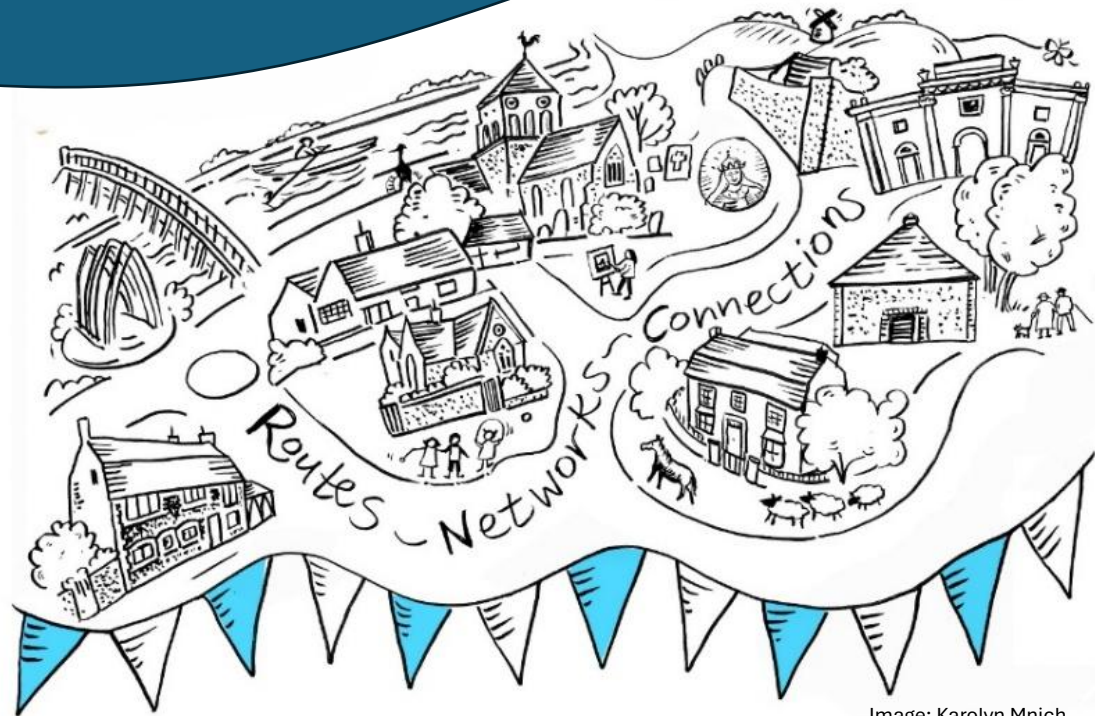

Old Shoreham Heritage Festival

6-15 September

2024

The Festival offers nine days of walks, talks, art, music and workshops from 6 to 15 September, organised in association with this year's national and European Heritage Open Days. The theme is *Routes, Networks and Connections*, a perfect fit with Old Shoreham's historic importance as a crossroads between the Sussex Weald and the sea, connected by the river to the coastal roads. For 2000 years the main east-west route across the River Adur has passed through the centre of the parish.

The Festival invites everyone in Adur to step outside the town centre and discover where Shoreham began - and 'where the wild things are'. It isn't only about the past: it's about getting a fresh perspective on the social and economic opportunities in our area and the potential for nature recovery.

The full programme and booking links are also available at the Heritage Open Days website, where you can see what else is happening locally.

Places on the guided walks, talks and workshops are limited. Book now to avoid disappointment.

The Old Shoreham Heritage Festival is organised by Friends of Old Shoreham, working with the Friends of St Nicolas, Adur Arts Collective, the Shoreham Society and many other local groups to build understanding of the history and natural beauty of this part of our area, and start some new conversations.

Children's costume trail in the church and grounds

Bring your children to enjoy our family trail in the church and churchyard, and learn more about this fascinating and historic building on our doorstep, once described as the mother church of Sussex, with walls that were already hundreds of years old when Bramber Castle and Shoreham's town centre were still in the ideas stage. And join in the dressing-up fun and learning with period-style clothing from medieval times specially made for the Festival by theatre and film costumier Joan Staley and her friends. You can also learn more about church vestments from the St Nicolas collection.

Thursday 12 September at St Nicolas 7pm

Reflections of Shoreham and the South Downs in poetry and song with Pauline Rutter and Bo Rutter, and Shoreham Women's Singing Circle led by Amy Hill.

Pauline Rutter is an archival artist and community and organisational poet. During this session she will be reflecting on how nature, local causes and initiatives and wider geo-political entanglements, influence her writing and other creative work. It is also an opportunity to hear about her National Trust commission for the Changing Chalk programme entitled 'From Collections to Connections.' This has further inspired her research and writing about the South Downs chalk grasslands flora and fauna including Mill Hill. **Illustrator Bo Rutter** will be discussing their approach to creating unique botanical illustrations for 'From Collections to Connections' and how they apply visual research techniques to art making.



Amy Hill works as a community musician and facilitates singing for health and wellbeing. Amy believes that wellness and connection blossom through the power of community connection and song. *"I'm passionate about bringing*

people together through music, and there's something truly special about the magic that happens when voices unite in harmony." Women's Singing Circle is a Shoreham group where singers explore their voices in the beauty of group singing

The Adur Valley: Shoreham's green gap

The river valley and Downs at Old Shoreham are a focus for several major programmes to protect and improve our natural and human heritage. The Old Shoreham Conservation Area, the Adur Site of Special Scientific Interest, Mill Hill Local Nature Reserve, UNESCO biosphere and South Downs National Park safeguard a large part of the district.

But in practice these protections are under-policed and underenforced. Speakers will highlight the importance and fragility of the area. How can we, as a local organisation and local people work together with these agencies as advocates, monitors, landowners and conservation volunteers? How can we develop local plans for conservation and a sustainable future?

The session will be chaired by Julian Shinn of the Green Party with panellists from Adur River Recovery, Changing Chalk (The National Trust), Ouse and Adur Rivers Trust, Shoreham and District Ornithological Society, Weald to Waves and the Sussex Wildlife Trust

Deeper, wider and older than you think: the River Adur and the Port at Old Shoreham

Old Shoreham contains evidence of 3-5000 years of human history and was a thriving village in Anglo Saxon times. It has been much more than a rural village because of its strategic location and as a crossroads between the sea, the interior and along the coast. It has continued in importance to the present day both as a highway and as a defensive location. Yet much of its history is unknown or forgotten. This session will focus on one aspect – was there an ancient port in Old Shoreham? It isn't clear.

Barbara Chandler and Geoffrey Mead will review the historic and archaeological evidence and identify what further investigations are needed. But they will also ask: What else don't we know? How can we explore these questions?

Illustrating Esther Waters

A creative workshop organised and led by Lois Pawson to illustrate the story of 'Esther Waters', the 1899 novel by writer George Moore, whose settings for the story in Old Shoreham include the Red Lion Inn, the river Adur and Buckingham Park - which is the venue for this fun workshop combining creative drawing, storytelling and local history.

This workshop includes an introduction to the story and to Buckingham Park, which features in this fictional story renamed as 'Woodview', the home of a racehorse owning family and their various servants, including Esther Waters, the main story character. Her story is about overcoming adversity and what in Victorian times would have then been considered scandalous - to be an unmarried mother. The story gives fascinating insights about life in Old Shoreham over 150 years ago. The writer George Moore was familiar with Shoreham and describes the town and surrounding areas in great detail.

All of the artwork created will be photographed and then made into a digital 'zine' shared with workshop participants.

This workshop is suitable for young people and adults.

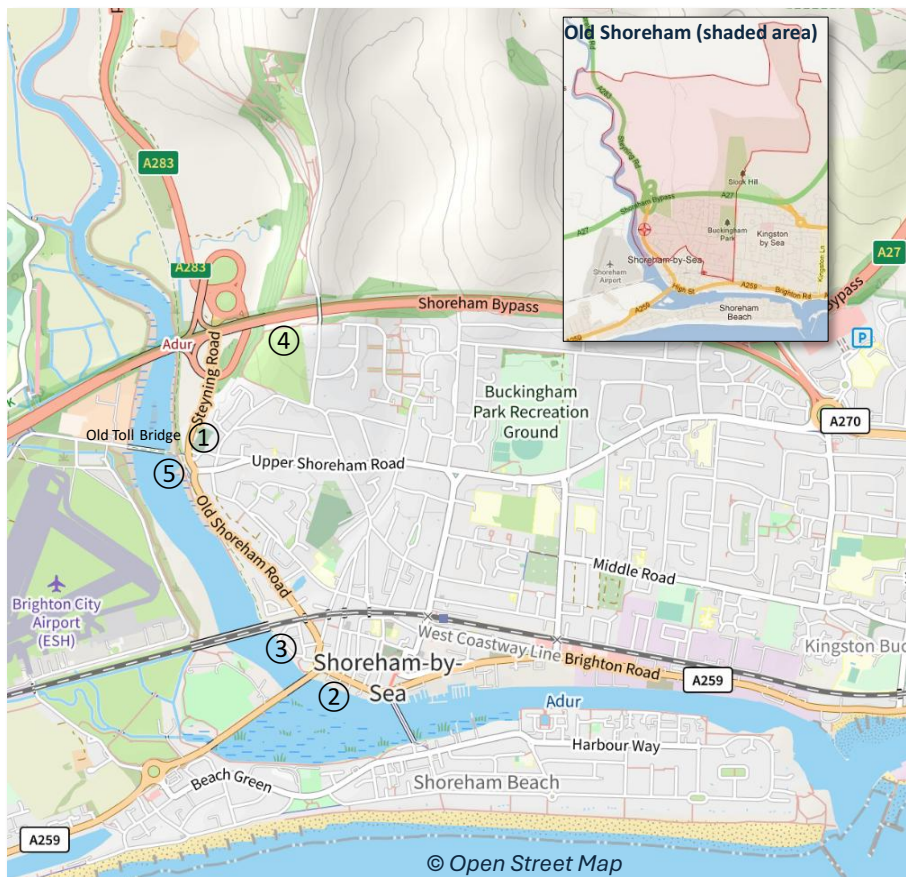

Old Shoreham ① has frequent train and bus services from Worthing and Brighton (Bus number 700 Coastliner) then by bus transfer, on foot or in a taxi.

BUS The No 2 bus provides a service to Old Shoreham from Shoreham station and High Street ② also from Steyning, Rottingdean and Brighton.

WALK The Downs Link riverside path and cycleway ③ leads directly from the town centre to the Toll Bridge or south from Steyning and Horsham.

BY CAR Take the A27 to the Shoreham turnoff ④ then drive to where the A283 and the A270 meet at the Red Lion and Amsterdam Inns ⑤.
